





Farewell to Fan Favorite Fehan



On Wednesday it was announced that after 25 years, Doug Fehan is stepping down from his role as Program Manager for the Corvette Racing team. Doug was one of the architects of what would become the most successful GT race team in the world. Together, the team would take the overall win at Daytona in 2001, 8 class victories at Le Mans, 113 worldwide victories, and 13 Manufactures Championships, which is more championships than all of their competitors COMBINED since the team started racing.

In addition to his work as Program Manager, he also served as a spokesperson for Corvette Racing where his interactions with the fans became legendary. With uncommon humor and candor, he would talk about the challenges of racing, while always emphasizing how Corvette is the best example there is today of technology transfer between race car and street car. Consequently, he saw every Corvette owner as a valuable member of the Corvette Racing team as they provided the support that fueled the team's success.

Thank you, Doug, for all that you have done for Corvette's reputation as performance icon, and for your work in making America's sports car respected all over the world. Most of all though, thank you for making us all a part of the team.

Doug is a member of the 2020 Corvette Hall of Fame. The induction ceremony is slated for April, 2020 as part of the Michelin NCM Bash.



Doug Fehan Didn't Retire, He Was Forced Out and I'm Mad As Hell About It

Throughout the long history of the Chevrolet Corvette, you will find a number of individuals with larger than life personalities who worked tirelessly to improve the brand. Classic figures like Harley Earl, Zora Duntov, and Bill Mitchell all come to mind, as well as the modern-day leaders who have led Corvette into the 21st century. This week, one of those individuals was let go by GM.

That collective gut-punch came on Wednesday with the announcement that Corvette Racing's Program Manager Doug Fehan would be <u>stepping down after 25 years of</u> <u>service</u>. The official press release gives fans the impression that it was Doug's decision, but according to a report by <u>SportsCar365.com</u>, it turns out that retirement wasn't Doug's idea, and he refused to comment further on the issue.

I haven't spoken with Doug about this, but I do have some things to say about the matter.

Doug Fehan IS the heart and soul of Corvette Racing for fans around the world. From the very start, the program has been guided by his hand. And now GM has removed its highly effective leader of the team just as it appears, we need him the most.

From everything we are hearing about the current state of racing, and especially the state of GT racing today requires that someone of his stature is representing the interests of Corvette and General Motors, as well as the fans. GT racing programs around the world are being shut down and scaled back. As the collective racing bodies like the ACO and IMSA work to advance a future standard for manufacturers (whatever that may be), it was always comforting to know that Doug would be there fighting for us as racing fans and as Corvette owners.

But perhaps Doug's most important contribution to Corvette was his unyielding belief that racing made the street cars better. It was Doug who popularized the term "Cascade Engineering" to describe how each generation of streetcar is made better from racing, and how each generation of race car was improved because of having a better streetcar as a starting point. That Pratt & Miller made a conscious effort to not just race Corvettes, but to try and make them better by sharing data and technical expertise with Chevrolet engineers on the team is what should be remembered just as much as all the victories and championships earned over the years.

I don't profess to know what happens behind closed doors at Corvette Racing, but it appears that these major changes have been building for some time. Back in September, GM's longtime racing director Mark Kent was shifted to GM Defense and former Camaro engineer Mark Stielow took his place as the new director of Motorsports Competition and Engineering. And since that move, major changes have been happening that also included the replacement of longtime Corvette "Captain" Oliver Gavin with former Porsche driver Nick Tandy.

I can imagine that Doug's larger-than-life personality and ego have rubbed some of GM's racing management the wrong way over the years, but you can't argue with the success that has resulted. In 22 years, Doug has led Corvette Racing to 14 Team Championships, 13 Driver's and Manufacturer Championships, as well as 113 race wins for the squad including eight class wins at the 24 Hours of Le Mans.

I can also firmly say that as someone who has met and talked with all kinds of people in and out of GM that there wasn't a better brand ambassador for Corvette and other GM vehicles than Doug Fehan and anyone who has witnessed one of Doug's Corvette Corral discussions can attest to that. These are some huge shoes to fill and I hope and pray that GM Racing hasn't messed up a winning formula just for the sake of change.

Thank you, Doug, for your service to Corvette and its fans over the years. You may be gone from the team that you built, but your contributions to Corvette, GM, and sports car racing will never be forgotten.

Update

Here are some additional thoughts on Fehan's departure from Corvette Racing from the <u>AutoExtremist</u> Peter DeLorenzo:

This is what I say. Doug was forced out. After 25 years of molding and shaping Corvette Racing into the entity that it is today, he was summarily dismissed with little or no warning and without cause. I think the move was motivated by two things: **1**. **Jealousy.** GM operatives couldn't stand the fact that Doug had more credibility and a genuine connection with Corvette enthusiasts than all of them put together. Doug also represented Corvette racing to IMSA, the FIA, the ACO, the Corvette Museum and the other race teams, and he had the utmost respect from all of them. Doug tirelessly lived and breathed Corvette Racing, and he woke up every day trying to make the program better. This will prove to be a huge error on GM's part. **2. Age-ism.** They'd never say that but that had more than a little to do with it as well. This is a Bush League Bullshit decision. Doug is simply the best at what he does. Corvette Racing wouldn't be what it is today without the commitment, dedication and passion of Doug Fehan. His winning legacy and his concept of racing "the right way" will endure for many, many years to come. -PMD

C8 Going Hybrid



As we have previously reported to you, Chevrolet will be releasing a new hybrid-electric variant of the C8 Corvette, titled the "E-Ray". Unofficial reports suggest there will be an electric drive unit situated in the front cargo area of the car, and to power the electric motors, four 1.94 kWh batteries placed in the center of the C8.

It is estimated the peak power of the electric motors will be approximately 115hp and 111lb of torque and feed the front wheels. Performance is a focus and the electric motors will enable torque vectoring to the C8's advance handling abilities. It is further reported that the E-Ray will not be able to drive on electric power only but will complement the estimated to be 600 horsepower V8 sitting in the middle of the car.

This hybrid supercar is also expected to have a slightly wider body than our current favorite C8, and wider wheels to enable more contact with the road. It's also projected the new build will include larger brakes. It's rumored this car will be launched in 2022 or possibly 2023, and available in both coupe and convertible formats. There is no price estimate yet for this hybrid option.

Peters Named Consulting Curator of Exhibits, Starts January 2021

A familiar face from General Motors is re-emerging from retirement to join the team at the National Corvette Museum. Tom Peters, former Director of Design for the GM

Performance Car Studio and 2019 Corvette Hall of Fame inductee, has joined the Museum's curatorial team effective January 2021 as Consulting Curator of Exhibits. Tom is no stranger when it comes to assisting with Museum exhibits, having co-curated 'Cartoon Creatures, Kustom Kars and Corvettes: The Art and Influence of Ed "Big Daddy" Roth', a special exhibit that officially opened in January, 2020 and continues through April, 2021. "Sean had the thought to see if Tom would be interested in being involved with the Museum in a more official capacity after his co-curation of the Rat Fink exhibit," shared Derek E. Moore, Director of Collections / Curator at the Museum. "Of course, his design background with GM is huge and we figured the best use of his talents would be in aiding us in the overall visual experience of our exhibits at the Museum."

The Museum's collections team, including Derek and Associate Curator Bob Bubnis, collaborate to develop a narrative plan and storyline for each exhibit, with plans to bring Tom into the fold to dig even deeper into the stories and the look of the exhibit.

"We want Tom to help build up our exhibits, tapping into his first-hand experience behind GM's closed doors," said Derek. "Tom can take those stories that are text on a label and help us bring them alive visually. We will look at how we can use the cars and artifacts we have to make our exhibits as much of a visual experience as they are educational – balancing the storyline with something visually interesting for our guests." With over 18 months of leadership at the National Corvette Museum under his belt, Dr. Sean Preston, President and CEO, is excited to continue investing in exhibits and Corvette history.

"We have Corvette Racing's Andy Pilgrim as our resident track pro at the NCM Motorsports Park, and now Tom Peters as a resident design pro at the National Corvette Museum. We are not only preserving and showcasing Corvette history, now we have a direct connection to that history – someone who was not only there to experience it, but who made that history during his career. This is truly a historic hire for the National Corvette Museum. We care deeply for the cars and artifacts in our care, but we also curate Corvette culture. Tom has a wealth of experience and understanding in both areas. He will be a welcomed addition to the already successful Curatorial and Collections team."

"I think the Museum has a great relationship with GM but bringing Tom on board just makes those connections even stronger," added Derek. "I'm excited to tap into his nearly 40 years of experience with the iconic automaker."

Even General Motors is excited about the move and looking forward to how Tom's skills can be further utilized to preserve, educate and promote the iconic Corvette.

"I can't think of a better choice for this position than Tom Peters," said Mark Reuss, General Motors president. "His institutional knowledge of Corvette and his enthusiasm for it are unmatched. Through the years, he has played a crucial role in maintaining Corvette's status as America's Sports Car, and, as Consulting Curator of Exhibits, he will ensure the National Corvette Museum remains the ultimate caretaker of Corvette's storied history and its dynamic future."

Tom is looking forward to playing a role in the Museum's exhibits moving forward, with a combination of remote work and regularly planned stints physically working in the Museum.

"The invitation to work with the National Corvette Museum, the first thing that struck me is that it's a fabulous honor," shared Tom. "I've always felt that working with the Corvette team was not only a dream and a privilege, but an incredible adventure and I've always regarded Chevrolet and Corvette as family. This is an extension and continuation of that. Working with Chevrolet and the Corvette team becomes more than just a job, it's part of your life and lifestyle."

First up for Tom will be helping to refine the new Enthusiast exhibit area, and Damsels of Design exhibit – which was fully funded by Elfi's Silver Pearl Sisterhood, a female-led philanthropic giving society of the Museum.

"We are excited that Tom was open to this opportunity. It's really going to bring the Museum to another level with the visual design of our exhibits," added Derek.

"To me, the possibilities are wide open," said Tom. "From the viewpoint of a customer coming in, or an enthusiast, you want them to feel like they're part of the team so they experience the excitement whether it's design, engineering, racing or even how you market cars. We have the opportunity to help guests fully understand the rich heritage behind what has inspired Corvette over the years in terms of vision, design and development... the way they have evolved and influenced culture around the world."

National Corvette Museum Named A Top Attraction By USA Today

The National Corvette Museum earned top honors in the 2020 USA TODAY 10Best Readers' Choice travel award contest for Best Attraction for Car Lovers.

Twenty automotive attractions were nominated by a panel of relevant experts which includes a combination of editors from USA TODAY; editors from 10Best.com; relevant expert contributors; and sources for both these media and other Gannett properties. The public was invited to vote daily over a four-week period for their favorite. The Museum earned the most votes and subsequently was named the Best Attraction for Car Lovers for 2020.

While much of the country spent the bulk of the 2020 spring travel season sheltered at home during the COVID-19 pandemic, staff at the National Corvette Museum used that time to find new ways to engage their audience through digital content, as well as undertake a major overhaul of multiple galleries within the exhibit space of the Museum.

From March 19 through May 8 the Museum debuted 32 episodes of a new 'Vettecademy' video series geared towards school-age kids, offering at-home educational and entertaining episodes on various aspects of Corvette. The series was so popular that a 'Fully Vetted' series was also launched, offering viewers of any age an in-depth look at various stories behind America's iconic sports car. Vettecademy as well as all eleven episodes of Fully Vetted are available for viewing on the Museum's website.

In addition to sharing virtual video content, the Museum also hosted a virtual online car show, with over 1,000 entries, and a virtual Michelin NCM Bash event bringing together live seminar speakers, produced content and live Museum walk-throughs all via Zoom. The event welcomed over 500 live online viewers.

Upon reopening to the public on June 8, visitors were greeted with a new 'look' of two galleries within the Museum including a heavily remodeled and digitally enhanced E. Pierce Marshall Memorial Performance Gallery, featuring 180-degree video projection; interactive touch screen kiosks with additional photo, text and video content; integrated artifact displays; and a shiny display floor full of iconic Corvette race cars.

"Thanks to the generosity of E. Pierce Marshall Jr. we were able to completely overhaul the former performance and racing exhibit space into a state-of-the-art gallery that truly showcases important examples of high-achieving track Corvettes," shared Museum President and CEO Dr. Sean Preston. "Pierce shared a love of Corvette with his father and continues his enthusiasm as an avid Corvette Racing fan and track competitor himself. His C7.R is an exciting centerpiece to this brand-new gallery."

Continuing the renovations and upgrades, the Museum also gutted the design and engineering area to create a new exhibit in collaboration with General Motors on the history of the development of the mid-engine Corvette. The "Vision Realized" exhibit features iconic prototypes and experimental vehicles including CERV-I, Astro II, XP-895 Reynolds-Aluminum Corvette, XP-819 'Ugly Duckling' rear-engine, XP-987 GT two-rotor Wankel engine, and the Indy Corvette along with artifacts and a comprehensive storyline of how Corvette's first Chief Engineer, Zora Arkus-Duntov, dreamed of one day offering a mid-engine Corvette as a production vehicle.

"The next generation Corvette has drawn the attention of not only die-hard Corvette enthusiasts, but also fans of other marques. This highly anticipated car and exhibit is something any performance car enthusiast is going to want to immerse themselves in," shared Sean. "What's even better is that visitors can observe as new owners take delivery of their 2020 Corvettes right here inside the Museum. It doesn't get any more exciting than that!"

During the pandemic the Museum also debuted a new exhibit display for the 1954 'Entombed' Corvette which was made possible through a donation by Robin and Mary Vann of East Tennessee. The Corvette Cave-In: Skydome Sinkhole Experience also received an upgrade to the digital technology that powers the sinkhole collapse animation, showcasing the eight Corvettes who fell victim. Finally, visitors to the Museum will browse a special exhibit: "Cartoon Creatures, Kustom Kars and Corvettes: The Art and Influence of Ed 'Big Daddy' Roth" featuring candy-colored fiberglass marvels of the late 50s to mid-60s as well as the subsequent vehicles they would influence, including two Corvettes used in the Transformer films.

"Our goals during the pandemic were to keep as many team members employed as possible and use the time to upgrade our visitors' experience – taking the Museum to another level," added Sean. "Our team worked hard to update the facility so that it reflects the look and feel of the next generation Corvette. We are excited for guests to see it for themselves."

The Museum is open daily, 8am-5pm CT and is located in Bowling Green, Kentucky at I-65, exit 28.




